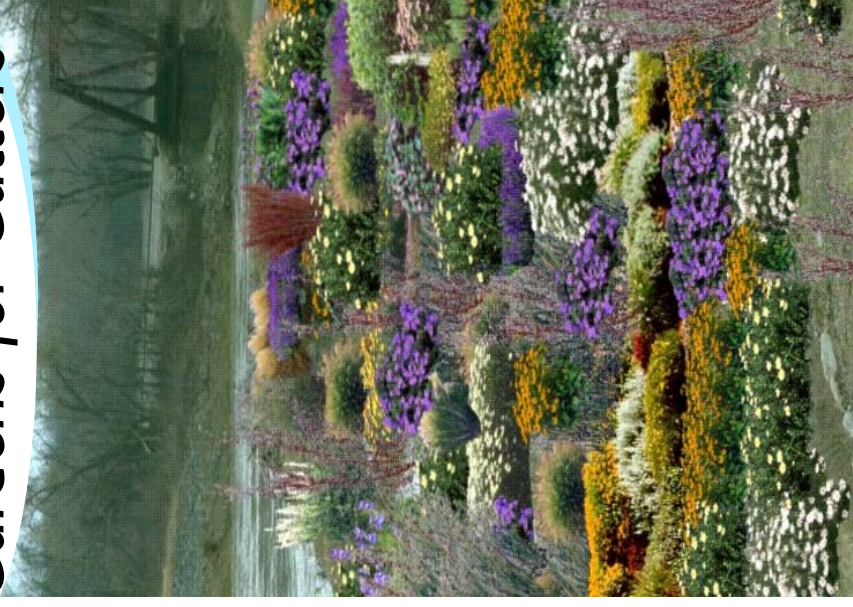

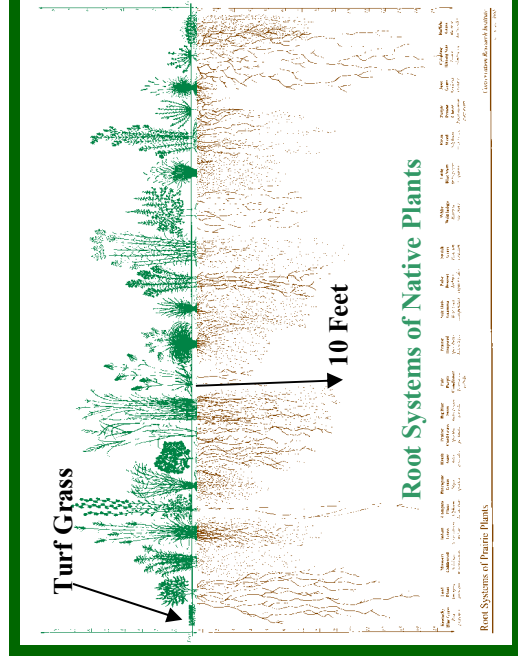


**Hard Surfaces =
